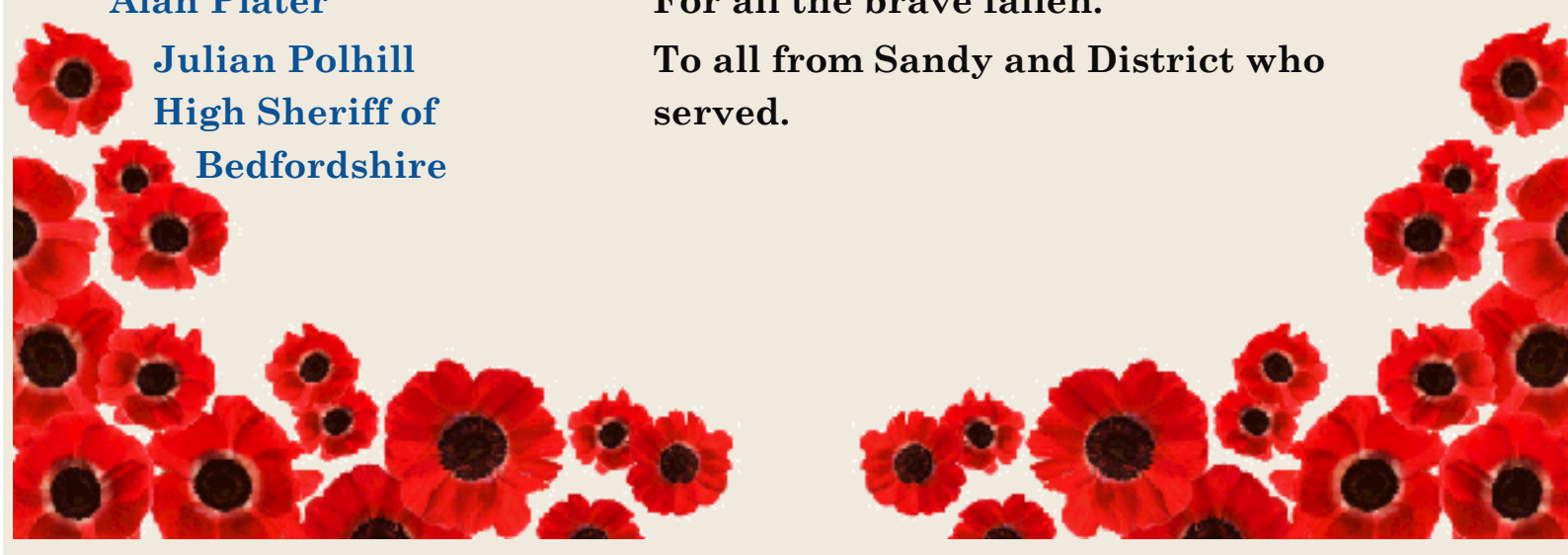
Great Uncle George, Died in 1917 aged
