The Committee objects to this retrospective planning application on the grounds of its proximity to houses and highway issues relating to unsuitable and narrow roads

It was reported that the appeal would be determined on the basis of written representations. The procedure to be followed is set out in Part 2 of the Town and Country Planning (Appeals)(Written Representations Procedure (England) Regulations, as amended. All the representations submitted to Central Bedfordshire Council would be forwarded to the Inspector and the appellant. These would be considered by the Inspector when determining the appeal. The Committee was invited to make comments or modify its existing comments. All representations must be received by the Planning Inspectorate by 12 February 2024.

The Committee discussed the importance of modifying its original response to the appeal submitted by GS Landscaping (Sandy Grab Services) to turn the small parcel of land in Beeston into a Soil Recycling Centre. Cllr B Blackley advised the meeting that a document had been been prepared by herself reflecting the views of local residents and would be submitted to the Government Inspector this week. A discussion took place about the application and its affect on the local area. The Committee discussed whether to amend its submission in the light of the information provided.

- 1. That the Committee modifies its comments to the Inspector as it is concerned by the implication of 45, 36-tonne HGVs passing through Beeston and onto the A1 daily because is only going to increase the pollution issue at the Sandy roundabout further.
